Zuma agrees to receive your letter about crime

You are one of more than 60 000 South Africans that wrote a letter about the crime situation in South Africa to our president.

President Jacob Zuma has agreed this week to receive the anti-crime letters sent by thousands of dissatisfied South Africans over the past two weeks. He will take delivery of the letters on Tuesday, 9 March.

Solidarity launched this campaign to put pressure on the South African government and to highlight the seriousness of crime. Solidarity thereby wants to ensure that the government raises the priority level of crime and tackles the issue as a matter of urgency.

To date, Solidarity has received more than 60 000 letters and SMSs from South Africans in which they express their dissatisfaction with the current crime situation and the government's handling of it. Solidarity also launched a video in which people tell their stories to the President last week.
